THEATER: *OFF Stage: The East Village Fragments* is a walking performance celebrating the birth of downtown's off-off-Broadway experimental aesthetic – the stuff of Sam Shepard, LaMaMa and Viet Rock, which concludes the evening. (The West Village version of this concept, the brainchild of Peculiar Works, recently took home an OBIE.) With 80 actors and 22 directors staging 29 scenes throughout the East Village, the production is a moveable feast of fringe and half-forgotten theater radicals. Reviewer Pete Boisvert was certainly satiated: “One of the most thrilling aspects of the evening is the anticipation of where the next scene will come from. I found myself studying passersby on the street, wondering if they would become part of the show next.” – John Del Signore
